- Sponsoring forums for the presentation of scholarly research and exchange of ideas;
- Providing publications that disseminate scholarly work, professional information, and general information related to the field and of interest to the public;
- Acknowledging outstanding scholarly accomplishments in the field;
- Fostering scholarship, research, and education about the history of the built environment;
- Organizing study tours of significant buildings and sites both in the United States and abroad;
- Supporting the preservation of historic places and cultural heritage.

The Society is a constituent member of the American Council of Learned Societies. Membership is open to all who are interested in furthering the study, enjoyment, and preservation of architecture and its related arts. In addition to receiving the Society's quarterly journal and bimonthly newsletter, members are eligible to attend the annual meeting, annual architectural tours abroad, and annual tours to regions of particular architectural interest in the United States or Canada.
